- Staff Young asked the CAC about preferences for a top level domain.
 - Member Garcia mentioned that having WPS short for Water Power Sewer can be an alternative of SFPUC to show that the agency does.
 - Member Clary expressed that having SFPUC would make more sense because it's what the agency has been referred to.
 - Member Nagengast agreed with Member Garcia's suggestion because of the confusion of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission with the California Public Utilities Commission.
 - Overall, the CAC liked ".gov" instead of ".com"
- Member Ekanem asked about the development of different personas
 using the website. Staff Young responded they need to add more
 personas and make sure that they are asking the right questions when
 they are developing the personas.

Discussion Topics:

- Member Ekanem commented before the presentation and thanked the staff for starting the discussion around air monitoring in the Bayview-Hunters Point.
- Member Clary asked what kind of permanence would the SFPUC have over air monitoring. Staff Padilla responded that the community partner is funded from different sources, which overall determines each project permanency.

- Member McKinney had asked would the data results from the air monitors be transparent, and would it be available to community members. Staff Padilla responded yes, the data would be available to community members and that it is one of the main objectives of the project.
- Member Perszyk asked if there are any plans to monitor particulate matter that is smaller than PM 2.5. Staff Padilla responded that the projects from that community are currently not analyzing anything smaller than PM 2.5.
- Member Kott had asked what the average emissions of PM 2.5 in the area that is being monitored. Member Padilla responded that the baseline of air quality has not been identified.
- Member Kott asked if there was an indication of the SFPUC operations and its air pollution impact in the Bayview-Hunters Point. Staff Padilla responded that he is unable to speak to the current level of emission but upcoming CAC presentations would address this topic.
- Member Ekanem expressed that he liked the idea of an air monitor at 1500 Oakdale, however, wanted to know where exactly it would be located at.
- Member Aragon expressed interest in how other environmental factors can impact air monitoring and quality, such as the fog and the quality of the air during the fires.
- Member *Perszyk* wanted to reiterate that air quality data should be available to the public in a timely matter.
- Member Tang has asked if there has been any interest in monitoring other chemicals other than PM 2.5. Staff Padilla responded that PM 2.5 is being monitored because it is a community concern, although the monitor from the BECO2N Network team will monitor other substances.
- Member McKinney asked if there is a timeline of when the monitors will become live. Staff Padilla responded that each project has a different timeline that is managed by different community partners.
