**CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code:** If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

a) **Approve** Amendment No. 1 to [Contract No. PRO.0229](#), Emergency Planning, Response, Training and Technical Support, with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., increasing the contract duration by five years, for a total contract duration of nine years, with no change to the contract amount, for project continuity of several emergency planning projects in the Plan Update Schedule that require consultant support. c) **Accept** work performed by M Squared Construction, Inc., under [Contract No. WD-2874](#), 8- and 16-Inch Ductile Iron Water Main Replacement on Joost Avenue from Ridgewood Avenue to Congo Street and Various Side Streets; **approve** Modification No. 7 (Final) decreasing the contract amount by \$1,030,562, with no change to the contract duration, for a total contract amount of \$6,276,367 and a total contract duration of 745 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and one month), to adjust the final contract amount to the value of actual contract quantities completed; and **authorize** final payment to the contractor. d) **Award** [Contract No. WW-789R](#), Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant 516 and 516A Sodium Bisulfite Storage Tanks and Fill Station, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Western Water Constructors, Inc., in the amount of \$12,190,000 and with a duration of 910 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and six months), to replace the aging sodium bisulfite tanks and ancillary system and construct the new system closer to the chemical injection point. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the

Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The San Francisco Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on the determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)
