Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements: Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

7. CONSENT CALENDAR

- a) Approve an increase of \$1,100,000 to the cost contingency for <u>Contract No. WW-753</u>, <u>Hayes Valley Sewer Improvements, with Precision Engineering, Inc.</u>, for a revised cost limit amount of \$13,026,557, to use an alternate resin for cured-in-place liners along the final segments of large diameter sewers to minimize community impacts and to replenish cost contingencies, with no change to the contract duration. - b) Award Contract No. WD-2901, San Andreas Pipeline 3 Drainage & Erosion Repair at Junipero Serra Park, in the amount of \$1,192,500, and with a duration of 360 consecutive calendar days, to the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid, JDB & Sons Construction, Inc., to divert stormwater and repair erosion adjacent to the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's easement for the San Andreas Pipelines in Junipero Serra Park within San Mateo County. Approve Amendment No. 5 to <u>Contract No. CS-247(R)</u>, <u>Customer and Administrative Services</u> for <u>Community Choice Aggregation Program</u>, with <u>Calpine Energy Solutions LLC</u>, increasing the contract amount by \$500,000 and extending the contract duration by three months, to continue managing meter data, billing, and providing customer care support for the CleanPowerSF program, for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$35,245,425 and total duration of nine years and nine months, and **authorize** the General Manager to seek Board of Supervisors

approval for a future amendment, if needed to ensure continuity of operations while a new multiyear service contract is established, to increase the contract amount by an additional \$2,700,000 and extend the contract duration by an additional six months, for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$37,895,426 and a total agreement duration of ten years and one month. Approve Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. PRO.0168.A, Engineering Services for Transmission Pipelines, PRO.0168.A, Engineering Services for Transmission Pipelines with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., to increasing the contract amount by \$7,000,000, to provide additional engineering design and support services for transmission pipeline capital improvement projects funded by the Hetch Hetchy Water Capital Improvement Program, for a total not-toexceed contract amount of \$14,000,000, with no change to the contract duration, to provide additional engineering design and support services for transmission pipeline capital improvement projects funded by the Hetch Hetchy Water Capital Improvement Program, subject to Board of Supervisors approval under Charter Section 9.118. (Robinson)
- 11. **Approve** Amendment No. 1 to <u>Contract No. PRO.0182</u>, <u>Electrical Engineering Services for the</u> <u>Hetch Hetchy Region, with AECOM Technical Services, Inc.</u>, increasing the contract amount by \$2,800,000, and extending the contract duration by one year, to continue providing engineering design and support services for electrical engineering planning, design, and engineering support during construction services for the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Hetch Hetchy Capital Improvement Programs for switchyards, substations, powerhouses, and other related facilities associated with the Hetch Hetchy system, for a total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$8,800,000 and a total contract duration of nine years.
