CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

- a) <u>Approve the terms and conditions of Amendment No. 1</u> to the Childcare Lease dated October 28, 2021 with Wu Yee Children's Services, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation for the childcare facility at the Southeast Community Center, to modify the scholarship program procedures. (Flynn)
- b) <u>Approve an increase of \$117,517 to the cost contingency for Contract No. WD-2896</u>, 12-Inch Ductile Iron Water Main Installation on Webster Street from Grove Street to Eddy Street, with M. Squared Construction, Inc., to procure additional ductile iron pipe necessary to, realign the pipe after encountering an unforeseen underground storage tank, and for additional traffic controls and support, for a revised cost limit of \$1,733,375, with no change to the contract duration. (Robinson)
- Award Contract No. WD-2906, Town of Sunol Pipeline Replacement at Arroyo de la Laguna Creek, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Mitchell Engineering, in the amount of \$4,789,385 and with a duration of 605 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and eight months), to replace a section of 12-inch diameter water main located in Sunol, CA.
- d) <u>Award Contract No. WD-2883R</u>, Millbrae Security Upgrades, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Rodan Builders, Inc., in the amount of \$8,204,000 and with a duration of 540 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and six months), to provide security upgrades at the Millbrae Campus. This action by the Commission constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the

CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)

- e) Approve a Greenhouse Gas-Free Energy Contract for CleanPowerSF that is subject to binding arbitration with Pacific Gas and Electric Company, in an amount not-to-exceed \$8,955,000 and with a duration of one year, and **authorize** the General Manager to seek Board of Supervisors approval of the contract. (Hale)
- f) Approve execution and submission of an attestation of veracity for Hetch Hetchy Power's 2023 Power Source Disclosure Reports and Power Content Label; approve final submission of the 2023 Power Source Disclosure Reports to the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission); and approve provision of the Power Content Label to all customers by January 31, 2025. (Hale)
- g) <u>Approve execution and submission of an attestation of veracity for CleanPowerSF's 2023</u> <u>Power Source Disclosure Reports and Power Content Label</u>; approve final submission of the 2023 Power Source Disclosure Reports to the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission); and approve provision of the Power Content Label to all customers by January 31, 2025. Accept work performed by JMB Construction under Contract No. WD-2797, San Francisco Westside Recycled Water Pump Station and Reservoir; approve Modification No. 19 (Final) increasing the contract amount by \$5,194, within the approved contingency amount, for a final contract amount of \$18,206,751, and increasing the contract duration by 236 consecutive calendar days, within the approved contingency duration, for a final contract duration of 1,845 consecutive calendar days (approximately five years), to complete punch list work associated with the Pacific Gas and Electric Company power service to the facility and to finalize closeout documentation; and authorize final payment to the contractor. - 11. <u>Approve Amendment No. 3 to Contract No. PRO.0096</u>, Mountain Tunnel Improvements Project Construction Management Services, with AECOM Technical Services Inc., increasing the contract amount by \$9,500,000 and extending the contract duration by five months, for a total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$34,000,000 and a total contract duration of eight years and five months, to continue providing specialized construction management services for the Mountain Tunnel Improvements Project, subject to Board of Supervisors approval under Charter Section 9.118. increase the delegation of authority under Section 21.43 of the Administrative Code to execute power supply contracts: a) with terms in excess of 10 years or requiring expenditures of \$10 million or more subject to an annual expenditure limit of \$300 million per year; and b) with anticipated revenue in excess of \$1 million or more subject to an annual revenue limit of \$300 million per year, from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2030. - 13. <u>Award Contract No. DB-138</u>, Southeast Treatment Plant Biogas Utilization Project, in the amount of \$121,541,812, and with a duration of 1,020 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and ten months), to the sole, qualified proposer, PCL Construction, Inc., to design and construct the Biogas Utilization Project, a subproject of the Biosolids Digester Facilities Project, to provide beneficial use of the biogas generated from the new digesters by converting it to renewable natural gas for pipeline injection.
